Public Transport

Coventry Rail station is approximately 4 miles from campus. Taxis are available outside the station or to get the bus please follow the signs from the station to Warwick Road (a 2 minute walk) and from there catch the National Express 12X, which travels onto main campus.

Canley Rail Station (serviced by London Midland from Birmingham New Street) is 1.3 miles from campus and takes approximately 25 minutes to walk. Please note there is not a taxi rank at this station.
